



Summer fun does not end after sundown in Essex County Parks. At many of our venues, it can be an all-day affair allowing visitors to enjoy the beautiful landscape of the county's 23 parks and five reservations while participating in a numerous variety of entertainment.

From June to September, the **Essex** County Free Summer Music Concert Series will enliven our parks with salsa, jazz, rock and roll, country, rhythm and blues, and more! There are numerous events planned during the early evening, including three concerts with fireworks in Weequahic Park, Branch Brook Park and Brookdale Park.

There are wonderful things happening at **Essex County Turtle Back Zoo**, even after dark. What happens at the zoo during the evening hours and how the animals manage late at night is unknown to many. Get a unique look at the zoo and its nocturnal animal collection at **Night Moves.** During this special program, visitors get a guided tour of zoo exhibits

where they will learn about different animal senses and adaptions.

In addition, **Essex County Turtle Back Zoo** has extended hours to 8:30pm on Wednesday and Thursday evenings during July and August when you can enjoy the facility when the summer temperatures are cooler and the workday is over.

On Thursdays, the Zoovies film series on the top floor of the zoo parking garage is a part of Wellness program as well. Each week's activities culminate on Thursday nights with Arts @ the Clipper Pavilion where visitors can participate in crafty programs with the Essex County Environmental Center staff.



Kay WalkingStick: An American Artist

Through June 17

The Montclair Art Museum is the final stop of the national tour of *Kay WalkingStick: An American Artist*, the first major retrospective of the artistic career of Kay WalkingStick (b. 1935), a citizen of the Cherokee Nation and one of the world's most celebrated artists of Native American ancestry.

Summer Closings

The museum's permanent collection galleries will be open through July 22, 2018 with Inspired by Matisse: Selected Works from the Collection, Undaunted Spirit: Art of Native North America, Philemona Williamson: In the Studio, and the George Inness Gallery. The museum will offer half priced admission during this summer special.

The Museum galleries will be then be closed for reinstallation through the month of August to prepare for an unprecedented and exciting fall exhibition schedule. SummerART Camp, summer classes and workshops for adults, and the MAM Art Truck, as well as other off-site activities will continue all summer long.

Come back Labor Day weekend for a reinstallation of the permanent collection Constructing Identity in America (1766–2017) starting September 1, 2018. Join as a member today for a first look at MAM's highly anticipated fall exhibition Kara Walker: Virginia's Lynch Mob and Other Works and Ben Jones: Envision Empower Embrace opening in September.

American Craft: A Newark Museum Sampler Ongoing

This is a new installation focusing on American Craft of the last 30 years. Furniture, silver, ceramics and glass objects demonstrate the diversity of the museum's landmark holdings in American Craft. There are masterworks by Native American and African-American artists as well as superb works by New Jersey's best-known studio craftspeople, such as Ubaldo Vitali and Paul Stankard.

Arts of Global Africa Ongoing

One of the centerpieces of the Newark Museum's revitalization project is the relocation of the Arts of Global Africa Permanent Collection into a new gallery space on the first floor, coinciding with the centennial year of the collection.

Art of the Ancient Mediterranean: Egypt, Greece & Rome Ongoing

After 28 years, Newark Museum's Ancient Mediterranean collection received a new home. The classical collection of art from Egypt, Greece

and Roman, comprised of nearly 4,500 objects dating from 3000 BC to 600 AD, was relocated from its original gallery space as part of the museum's renovation project that includes the reopening of the main entrance on Washington Street and the relocation and reinstallation of the Arts of Global Africa galleries.

Hot, Hotter, Hottest: 300 Years of New Jersey Ceramics Ongoing

The Newark Museum was the first in the nation to celebrate regional industry with its 1915 exhibition *The Clay Products of New Jersey*. One hundred and one years later, a new, interactive permanent gallery for the museum's unparalleled collection commemorates the Garden State's great history as one of the great pottery and porcelain centers of the Western World.

Newark: City of Silver and Gold from Tiffany to Cartier Ongoing

Newark was home to a number of important silver companies, and was the center of a vast gold jewelry industry. By 1900, sterling silver objects were being mass produced at modest cost and sold through jewelry stores in every state in the country. In the same period, 14-karat gold jewelry had become a staple of modern fashion for men and women.

Party Time: Re-Imagine America – A Centennial Commission by Yinka Shonibare MBE

Originally created in 2009 in honor of the Newark Museum's Centennial, *Party Time: Re-imagine America* is a major site-specific installation by internationally acclaimed artist Yinka Shonibare MBE.

Repertoire by Molly Hatch Ongoing

Ceramic artist Molly Hatch has been commissioned to produce a monumental three-part installation in the niches of the Engelhard Court. *Repertoire* will be her largest commission to date, honoring the Newark Museum's 107-year-tradition

of collecting contemporary ceramic art, and commemorating the retirement of Curator of Decorative Arts Ulysses Dietz after 37 years.

Style And Status In Sterling: American Silver in the Newark Museum ~ Ongoing

100 pieces of American silver from the 1600s to 2017 tell the story of silver in American life – its art, its meaning, its history, its beauty. These are amazing objects with amazing stories to tell.

When Objects Became Art Ongoing

This new installation highlights the Newark Museum's century-old commitment to collecting and displaying modern ceramics and glass as art. Art ceramics purchased between 1911 and 1926 will be spotlighted, along with three examples of art glass from the 1920s.
