



The Old Force Homestead, consisting of the Theophilus Ward/Thomas Force House and the Condit Family Cook House, is currently owned by the Township of Livingston and serves as both a museum and the headquarters for the Livingston Historical Society. This historical site was added to the New Jersey and National Registers of Historic Places in 1981.

Originally built around 1745, the house was expanded significantly in the early 19th century and remains one of the few farmhouses from that era in Livingston of which much of its original structure and craftsmanship has been preserved. The farmhouse and surrounding park offer a unique glimpse into rural life in Essex County during the 18th and 19th centuries. **Open 2-4pm on Saturday and Sunday.**
