An Essex County Gem Offers Panoramic Views

The top of Essex County Eagle Rock Reservation provides an unparalleled view of the New York and Newark skylines. For centuries, people have traveled there to see the world around them. However, while the vista is amazing, being at the mercy of weather often made visits short.

To address this issue, Essex County commissioned a "casino" to be built. Not used for gambling, this building is more like the original Italian meaning of the word: a small country villa. Opened to the public in 1912, it offered park patrons covered lookout areas on two levels, allowing them an excellent view from multiple angles. A vendor sold light refreshments, hoping to encourage people to linger. The structure allowed very little to impede the view, however, that very design permitted wind

and rain to enter the viewing area and at times prevented visitors from really enjoying the experience.

Plans were drawn up to correct the problem and the Essex County Parks Department, then known as the Parks Commission, sought a permanent use for the building, considering options such as a tea house, milk bar, or environmental center. Without the presence of an ongoing operation in the space, the building was prone to vandalism and fell into disrepair, further discouraging visitors.


Then in the 1980s, Essex County partnered with an established restauranteur who restored the building and opened a celebration venue. This partnership finally allowed the building, and location, to

achieve its true purpose. With the opening of the restaurant, park patrons could relax in a sheltered place that still provided them with remarkable views of the surrounding cities and nature.



Located in Essex County Eagle Rock Reservation in West Orange, NJ, The Highlawn is known throughout the region for fine dining and its dedication to making each celebration memorable and unique. It has been the trusted venue of many private groups, Fortune 500 companies, non-profit organizations, local community associations, and many more, and is a recipient of OpenTable's Diners' Choice Awards for the Top 100 Scenic View Restaurants.
