#### A MESSAGE FROM THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Dear Friend.

In July, we were pleased to reopen Essex County Francis Byrne Golf Course after completing a major renovation. The project preserves the historic details created by noted golf architects Harold Banks and Seth Raynor who originally designed the course in 1928 and integrates modern drainage and irrigation systems. This has kept the course vibrant and attractive and provides our golfers with championship caliber playing conditions.

Since taking office, it has been our ongoing initiative to revitalize our historic Essex County Parks System and ensure residents have up-to-date facilities that meet their recreation needs. In addition to modernizing athletic fields and playgrounds, enhancing landscaping and preserving historic features, we aggressively are introducing more pickleball courts at our tennis facilities. Earlier this summer we opened four new pickleball courts at Essex County Grover Cleveland Park and will transition more tennis courts for pickleball use in Brookdale Park, Verona Park and Branch Brook Park to ensure participants of this growing sport have pristine places to play.

I invite you to check out your local park and experience our open spaces. Also, mark your calendars for our annual Halloween-themed events: Dress up the dog members of your family and participate in one of our Strut Your Mutt Parades and Costume Contests, witness the carved jack-o-lanterns at Gardens Aglow or welcome the new season at our Fall Family Festival! The fall season is a fantastic time to discover all that our Parks System offers.

Essex County Francis Byrne
Golf Course: **Preserving** the Past in a Championship **Caliber Facility** 

#### **Essex County added another** crown jewel to its historic Parks System in 1978 when it acquired The West Course from **Essex County Country Club** in West Orange.

Designed by famed Golf Course Architects Seth Raynor and Charles Banks and originally opened in 1928, the 178-acre facility featured a rolling hillside terrain that bordered the Rahway River. Essex County recently completed an \$8.7 million comprehensive course renovation, the first time the course received a facelift in its 95-year history.

"Essex County Francis Byrne Golf Course is known for its historic features and beautiful vistas. The work that was done addresses long-standing issues affecting the course, and modernizes drainage and irrigation systems so that golfers are provided with championship caliber playing conditions," DiVincenzo said.

Under the leadership of DiVincenzo and with support from the Board of County Commissioners, Essex County set out to update the facility while preserving its historic features and creating championship caliber playing conditions at Francis Byrne Golf Course that golfers of all skill levels could enjoy. Essex's golf team, comprised of Golf Director Tim Christ, Golf Course Architect Stephen Kay and course builder Turco Golf. did not have far to turn, already having experience modernizing Essex County Hendricks Field Golf Course in Belleville, which also was designed by Banks.

The project included rebuilding all the

greens complexes, bunkers, cart paths and tee complexes, removing dead and hazardous trees, redesigning several golf holes and invested in new electric golf carts. Improvements that golfers will not notice, but are integral to operations, are new irrigation systems at tees and greens for better and more efficient use of water, new irrigation pumps to enhance efficiency, a new maintenance building to house golf equipment, new bathrooms, and a new open-air pavilion for golf

The completion of renovations at Francis Byrne Golf Course means that work at all three of the County's public golf courses has been completed within the last six years. Hendricks Field

Golf Course in Belleville underwent a similar modernization initiative and was reopened in 2021. Weequahic Golf Course in Newark saw its entranceway revamped with a new parking lot and open-air pavilion, renovations to The First Tee Learning Center and redesigned 10th and 11th holes completed in 2017.

These improvements are part of the Executive's ongoing initiative to revitalize the Essex County Parks System and provide the most up-to-date recreation facilities for residents to enjoy. They make sure our golf courses are relevant, fun, affordable, and accessible for all who may want to partake in the leisure and beauty of our great open spaces, especially our classically designed golf courses.
