The grounds at Riker Hill Art Park are open from dawn to dusk seven days a week. There are winding trails, outstanding views of West Essex and outdoor sculptures for the public's enjoyment. Artists' studios are open twice a year, on the first weekends in June and November, for an Open House and Art Sale. During this semi-annual event, visitors can watch artists at work and purchase art work in the gallery.


