



CONTEST CATEGORIES

PreK-2nd | 3rd-5th | 6th-8th | 9th-12th Maximum 5 participants per project entry.

Judging will be based on construction, creativity and best design for feeding intended wildlife species.

Eligibility: The contest is open to individuals—children —and organized groups, such as families, home-schoolers, faith-based organizations, clubs, scout troops, bakers, culinary students, nature/outdoor enthusiasts, etc. There is a maximum of five participants allowed per project entry.

Submissions: Must be delivered no later than 5pm on Friday, December 20, 2024.

Late entries will not be considered for a prize, but will be enjoyed and appreciated by the animals!

Drop-off: At the Essex County Environmental Center, 621-B Eagle Rock Avenue, Roseland, NJ 07068.

Awards: Winners will be announced once judging is completed. Grand prizes awarded to entries that place **1st** in all categories; 2nd and 3rd place entries will be recognized with a plaque, certificate and a small gift.

CONTEST RULES

- On delivery each entry <u>must include</u> an entry form.
- All entries must be an original construction and include wildlife friendly edible ingredients (example: corncobs, gourds, pumpkins, bird seed, fruit, acorns, sticks). Please NO meat, chocolate or candy; these are NOT animal friendly products.
- No plastic is allowed. Construction with biodegradable compostable materials is encouraged (sticks, paper rolls, jute, cardboard); the use of screws and nails is acceptable to hold the project together.
- Each entry must fit on top of a flat tree stump no larger than 14" x 14". The stump will be provided—please do not bring your own. You may use nails or screws to stabilize the structure. Ramps or other design features that help the animals access the food are acceptable.
- Materials should withstand the elements and provide feed for multiple days. Intended animal species to feed include squirrels, chipmunks, blue jays, cardinals, chickadees, other winter birds and forest wildlife.
- ECEC reserves the right to disallow any submission deemed objectionable or unsafe.
- ECEC is not responsible for any damage to or disappearance of the project.
