Leanne McGowan is the Energy Program Manager on the Sustainable Jersey Energy Team, managing and creating programs to support the Sustainable Jersey-PSE&G Energy Efficiency Partnership Program and the PSE&G EmPowered Schools Program to improve energy efficiency and sustainability practices in municipalities and schools. Her role includes energy program outreach and training for municipalities, schools and green teams to empower residents and business owners to better understand and manage energy use and lower their carbon footprint.

Gray Russel has served on the Essex Environmental Commission for 15 years; he recently retired as Sustainability Officer for the Township of Montclair, and currently sits on the Montclair Environmental Commission. In 2018, Gray helped form the Sustainable Essex Alliance (SEA), bringing Community Choice Clean Energy Aggregation Programs to residents in several Essex communities. That Alliance later won an Environmental Achievement Award from the Association of New Jersey Environmental Commissions, and a Collaboration Award from Sustainable Jersey, naming them "Sustainability Heroes".
